The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m.

Meghan Zingle, Town-wide World Language Department Supervisor presented along with teachers Julie Colbert, Mick Posner and students from the Conard and Hall High School's American Sign Language classes I and II. Mick Posner, a high school teacher who is also deaf, spoke along with sign language interpreter Julie Colbert, explaining the program and what the students learn. Students Noah Fox, Skylin Macy, Pax Gregory, and Jessie Connelly-Cohen each highlighted their individual experiences which included interpreting for a student at Charter Oak International School. Skylin Macy, also a deaf student, stated how exciting it is for her to see students taking the ASL classes. Within a one year time students learn not only how to sign, but also learn about the deaf community, the culture, the vocabulary, and encourage elementary and middle school students to learn to sign. Students agreed that they would like to see ASL classes brought to the elementary and middle schools. The Board thanked the students and teachers and asked questions regarding the number of students who take the ASL class and if there is a possibility in the future of an ASL 3 class.

won both awards. Congratulations also to Lauren Drazen and Jingjing Wu who are this year's national outstanding recipients of the Chinese Language Association Award. On November 9, 2017, the Adult Education graduation ceremony will take place. All are encouraged to stop by any of the schools this Friday for Veterans Day celebrations.

Dr. Andrew Morrow, Assistant Superintendent, presented to the Board his report on Middle School Teaming. Dr. Morrow was joined by: Mr. Paul Vicinus, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment, and Principals Mr. Andrew Clapsaddle, Mr. Steven Cook, and Ms. Joy Wright. Dr. Morrow described teaming, a component of each of our three middle schools, as a transition experience for middle school students. Teaming seeks to address both the academic and emotional transition for adolescents as they move from one classroom in fifth grade to the larger independency of high school. Ms. Wright spoke on the well-being of students and wrap around supports. Communication is a key factor, and within each grade level, teams have team leaders who communicate with team teachers. Communication is also important between teachers and families. At King Philip, a homework page is set for students and families with a 'key points section' for parents to ask questions of their students. Ms. Wright expressed that teams allow students to have a caring group of people who are concerned about their well-being as well as academic success and teams also allow for students to have common experiences and use common strategies to support students who are struggling in the classroom. Mr. Steve Cook added that teams allow positive support with a common goal of teachers to make sure that students are prepared for high school by ensuring that they end up in a classroom environment that will promote growth. Mr. Andrew Clapsaddle spoke on interventions that teaming allows in the middle school so that students don't fall through the cracks. These interventions include tier 1, 2 and 3 supports as well as time for student and teachers to meet. The Board asked questions on the impact and cost of teaming, the possibility of eliminating teaming in the eighth grade, cross teaming, and eighth grade students transitioning to ninth grade.
